 - 6.3. Patient-Centred: The doctor places a strong emphasis on patient-centred care. They prioritise not only the clinical aspects but also the personal and emotional aspects of Mrs. Anderson's

experience, recognising the importance of understanding the person behind the patient.

- 6.4. Communication Skills: The doctor's ability to engage in meaningful conversation with Mrs. Anderson, asking open-ended questions and encouraging her to share personal memories, suggests strong communication skills. They create an environment where the patient feels comfortable opening up.
- 6.5. Reflective: The doctor reflects on the significance of their interactions with Mrs. Anderson and recognizes the value of connecting with patients on a personal level. This suggests a willingness to learn and grow in their role as a healthcare provider.

2-3	Some explanations with relevant quotations, some reference to language techniques.	Mrs. Anderson enjoys talking with the writer in source A. This is proven by the quote "Her eyes lit up as she recounted stories of family, travels, and cherished memories." Similarly, Ms. Rodriguez is very pleased with the work that the writer produced for her as shown in the quotation "A smile gradually spread across her face, and her eyes sparkled with recognition". The verb "sparkled" proves this.
4-5	Clear explanations with relevant quotations, accurate use of language techniques.	Mrs. Anderson has a very warm reaction to the writer in source A as proven by the quotation "eyes lit up". This metaphor used to describe someone's eyes brightening with excitement, enthusiasm, or joy. The phrase creates a vivid image of the person's emotional reaction. Their eyes "lighting up" suggests a sudden and genuine emotional connection to the stories being recounted. Similarly, Ms. Rodriguez has a very warm and affectionate reaction to the writer in source B as proven by the quotation "her eyes sparkled with recognition", a metaphor to describe the woman's eyes. "Sparkled" suggests a sudden and visible brightness in the eyes, often associated with excitement or delight. The use of the verb "sparkled" enhances the idea of her being enthused and engaged in her interactions with the writer, implying a strong connection between them both.
